The Argument

A multilevel distributed perspective presses us to examine educational leadership as a *systemwide* practice by attending to how aspects of the micro, meso, and macro *interact* to constitute educational leadership practice. School leaders, teachers, children, parents and wider school community

A *Multilevel* Distributed Perspective

- Educational leadership practice is embedded in multiple overlapping relationships with teachers, students, school leaders, parents, community leaders, system leaders, and other stakeholders.
- Importance of attending to schools, communities, school systems, and the educational sector broadly.
- Anchor the practice of educational leadership in teaching and learning.


